

Summer camp 2024 Parents common questions and answers (As of Thursday, April 11th, 2024)

New or updated programming/notes

- 1. Camp is from Tuesday, July 2nd to Friday, August 9th (6 weeks). Camp is from 9am to 4pm.
- 2. Daycare hours are at your child's respective centers are from 7am 9am and 4pm 6pm.
- 3. You can sign up for more weeks during the summer (you can add weeks online through your Amilia account).
- 4. Please note that the center locations may change for the following reasons:
 - a. Unexpected renovations decided by the EMSB
 - b. More or less camper registrations for a particular grade level.
 - c. If anything changes, we will let you know (by the end of May).
- 5. Your child's grade will be the grade that he or she graduated from in June 2024.
- 6. Registration will take place online, we are available to help register by phone and in person by appointment only.
- 7. We have hired a Special Needs Coordinator to assist in the intergration and evaluation of campers in our care.
- 8. We are introducing a "Life Skills" program for grade 6 and Teen Spirit (this will include weekly workshops such as, cooking, self-care, basic repairs, mental health support, communication, etc.).
- 9. We are looking for tshirt sponsors! Income tax reciept and other publicity incentives included (from 1000\$ to 5000\$).

SUMMER CAMP 2024 COMMON QUESTIONS ASKED BY PARENTS!

Please note:

- 1. On the first day of camp, you will receive a parent information booklet that has the program calendar and other information. This information will also be online a week before camp starts.
- 2. Your child's camp T-shirt will be given out during the first week and should be worn only on outings or special events.

ALL INFORMATION IS SUBJECT TO CHANGE (UPDATED ON April 4, 2024)

Question 1: Where does my child go?

- For Smiley Bunch kindergarten camp, the center will be at East Hill school.
- For grade 1: It will be at Leonardo Da Vinci Academy.
- For grades 2 and 3: It will at the YLC 2nd floor.
- For grades 4, 5, 6: It will be at the YLC 3rd floor.
- For Teen Spirit (Secondary 1 and 2 and 3), it will be at Michelangelo school.
- Please note that entrance to the YLC's camp centers is by the parking lot.
- There is no air conditioning at the schools. Even during the school year.

Question 2: How does Daycare work?

- Daycare is from 7am to 9am and 4pm to 6pm.
- It is supervised by the animators of your child's center. You can sign up for daycare anytime during the summer.
- Consistent lateness or not respecting the daycare hours registered, results in a higher daycare rate.
- You must sign-in and out your child at the "daycare desk".
- Daycare will be at your child's center.
- If you have 2 or 3 children at camp, we recommend picking up the younger one first and then head to the other center(s). Don't worry, we will never leave a child alone outside.

Question 3: What should my child bring every day?

It is important that your child brings the following items on a daily basis in a durable backpack.

- Sunscreen (SPF 50 or higher) You must apply sunscreen before arriving at camp each day.
 We will reapply during the day for the younger levels. Older children are expected to apply it on themselves (with our assistance if needed).
- A healthy lunch and snacks. <u>NO PRODUCTS WITH NUTS.</u> We do not use microwaves. Please make sure
 your child(ren) lunches are tightly sealed and kept fresh (put an ice pack in the lunch bag if necessary).
- If a lunch is forgotten, we will contact you to purchase some food for your child. You will then reimburse your coordinator.
- A lock for public pool changing room lockers.
- Pool sandals/ water shoes for water activities.
- Bathing suit and towel.
- Water bottle.
- Cap/sun hat
- Running shoes WITH socks. NO SANDALS/ETC.
- Your center coordinator will provide you with a list of specific items that you need per age level.



- For grades 4+5+6 and Teen Spirit: 2 bus tickets (for long walks and/or outings) that will be left with the animator.
- Please keep in mind that we are not responsible for lost, stolen or damaged items.
- Most of the day will be spent outside with activities ranging from quiet to active geared towards that age group. They will take breaks throughout the day and where possible, in the shade. It's summer after all!

Question 4: Can parents volunteer on outings?

- Yes! Providing there is a need or space for extra supervision. Give your name to your child's coordinator. If there is a need, we will contact you.
- Please keep in mind that parents will NOT be put in the same group as their child.
- This is based on experience that we sometimes need to "supervise" the parent.
- No snacks can be purchased by the parent on outings.
- Please notify your child's coordinator if you are interested.

Question 5: Where will the campers go swimming?

- "Smiley Bunch" K-camp for the majority of time, will use the splash pads at East Hill school.
- Grades 1 and 2 will go swimming at the indoor Centre Aquatique of RDP in the "kiddie section" (right
 beside Jean Grou High school) <u>OR</u> the Don Bosco park (former Alexis Carrel park) outside <u>kiddie pool</u>
 providing we have the proper supervision (ratio 1:4). The water will never be higher than the knees of a
 standing child.
- If the pools are not available or we can't reach our ratio, water activities will be planned at the YLC or local parks. From our experience, children of this age group just enjoy "getting wet".
- The older levels (grades 3 and up) will for most of the time, go to the Don Bosco (former Alexis Carrel park) outdoor pool or have an outing to another pool in the Montreal.

Question 6: How is the day / week structured?

- The day will range from quiet to semi-active to active activities according to the physical and social development of the age group/center.
- The week is comprised of theme days, sports, outings, dance, "life skills", games, songs, FaithSpace (optional), center events, "universal special events", special animation programming, swimming, and sports activities.
- Most of the activities will take place at your child's respective center and immediate surroundings.
- Activities range from social, leisure, educational, moral, cultural and recreational programming.
- Animators will follow an approved daily plan from the coordinator for the day.
- You will receive a Parent Information booklet with the camp calendar and other important information describing your child's summer experience and expectations on the first day of camp. Please see online at dbylc.com for last year's programs.
- Usually, the new Parent Information booklet will be available online the week before camp starts.
- Friday mornings are usually a child geared church celebration at Maria Ausiliatrice parish (optional).
- Friday afternoons are usually "universal" camper events (Carnival day, Walk a thon, Derby race, etc).

Question 7: How do outings work?

- There will be 3-4 outings during the camp program (2 universal outings which means all the centers go to that outing and 1-2 center major outing. Subject to change).
- These mini and/or major outings can be "in house" (where an organization/recreation company comes to the center, or the center goes to a particular place (example: Biodome).
- All the outings are incorporated into the registration fee (that means they are free).
- "Major-outings" are by yellow bus and Mini-outings are by city transportation if available.
- Teen Spirit outings are not included in the registration (as the registration is only 50\$/week).



- When by city transportation, the city bus is "reserved" for us and does not do the normal bus stops. The bus will pick up the campers at a certain bus stop and drop them off at a certain bus stop close to the outing. This is not yet confirmed for this year by the City of Montreal. More information to follow.
- You will receive the outing form on the first day of camp. Please check off which outings you would like your child to attend. If anything changes, let us know the latest **TWO DAYS BEFORE THE OUTING.**
- No permission slips for major outings will be accepted on the day of the outing. It is not meant to exclude campers but rather to ensure proper supervision and space in the yellow buses.
- Please follow the procedures on your center's outing form (that you will receive first day of camp).
- Parents who choose not to send their child on an outing have the option of leaving their child at camp for the day. If there is less than 20% of the campers at a center staying back on a major outing, they will then be put at another center for the day.
- No campers will be allowed to stay back on our "UNIVERSAL OUTINGS". If you choose not to send your child, they will have to stay home as the whole staff will be on these outings. Universal outings are outings that the WHOLE camps goes to (from Grade 1 to Teen Spirit).
- Strict rules are applied by the animators and reinforced by the coordinators for all outings and public transportation. A review of safety procedures is also done with the campers.
- If an outing is cancelled or rescheduled (due to circumstances beyond our control) to another camp week, there is no reimbursement.
- We may allow the camper who is not registered for that week to attend the outing providing there is space available.

Question 8: How does early dismissal and absence procedure work?

- A note is required by the parent (in advance) to be given **DIRECTLY** to the animator who then discusses it with the coordinator. Campers will only be dismissed at the respective center.
- In **RARE** situations, campers can be dismissed at a different site (park, pool, outing, other center...) providing the coordinator speaks to the person who is picking up the child (is verified on the registration documents) and approves it. No exceptions.
- Please share all personal matters (divorce, custody, other) pertaining to your child's safety and well-being with the respective coordinator and / or with Amy El Zammar or Theo. The more we know, the more we can provide a "SafeFun" experience for your child(ren).
- If you are aware that your child will be absent for the day, please send in a note or contact the animator/coordinator or leave a message at your child's centers phone number. NOT THE YLC.
- The coordinators only make phone calls to the camper's home around noon (due to busy mornings at the center)

Question 9: Is camp from 9am to 4pm?

- Yes. Dismissal is at 4pm. We ask all parents to be present five minutes earlier to notice your child as they leave the centers.
- **DO NOT DOUBLE PARK AT THE YLC OR AT THE SCHOOLS! THIS SELFISH ACT IS VERY DANGEROUS!** The police will be doing check-ups and giving tickets on a regular basis. Blatant and repetitive parents who double park will annul their child's camp registration with no refunds given.

If you're late...

- Some animators will be with the dismissed campers outside as they wait for the child to be picked up.
 However, please keep in mind that the animators have other duties to attend to after camp and they cannot continue to animate after 4pm.
- If you won't be able to make it for 4pm, please contact your child(ren)'s center. If need be, please pick up your younger child before the older one.
- Make sure to have your child's center number saved on your phone.
- Please call if you will be late. Consistent lateness will result in a "supervision/daycare" fee to be paid directly to the coordinator. And a recommendation to register for daycare. (continued next page)

- If the parent is late, we will bring the child back inside the center (around 4:15pm). We will not leave a child alone to wait outside.
- Make sure you write down on the registration form ALL THE PEOPLE that can pick up your child from camp.

Question 10: Does my child have to wear the camp t-shirt every day?

- No. Camp T-shirts MUST be worn on all outings. This is to enhance identification, safety, and supervision during an outing.
- In some cases, we ask the campers to wear their camp T-shirt on special events (e.g. Walk-a-thon, last day of camp, etc...)
- A t-shirt of the same color may be worn (or one of previous years) if the camp T-shirt of this year is dirty or for other reasons.
- The t-shirt is included in the registration fee. Sizes may be a little big on your child (never smaller). We "guesstimate" the sizes according to age and center. At times, we can replace if we have extras.
- A replacement fee for a lost t-shirt during the camp season is 20\$.

Question 11: What is the Code of Conduct on the registration form?

New for 2024

- The Code of Conduct is the way in which we expect campers to behave while at summer camp. It is also a tool that the camp staff can use to encourage transparent and stronger communication and assistance to parents. In particular with campers who choose not to listen to their animators, who express their frustration with aggressiveness and/or foul language, or who abuse others.
- The YLC, with its limited resources, will do its best to journey with campers who have difficulty following the code of conduct.
- We are not able to keep any camper we feel we are not equipped to handle, nor can we keep a camper who has repeatedly ignored the code of conduct. You will receive a partial reimbursement.
- This is to ensure the safety of other campers and the staff as a whole and to not diminish the opportunity for an enjoyable summer camp EXPERIENCE FOR ALL CAMPERS AND STAFF.
- The more we know, the more we can help! This is why we strongly recommend an open and honest communication between parents and staff. Speak to Amy and your child(ren)'s coordinator.

Question 12: Do you accept children with special needs?

New for 2024

- As with the code of conduct, you will see on the registration form a section to fill out if you know or feel that your child has a special need or requires special attentiveness.
- Your honesty and assistance helps to ensure a safer and more enjoyable camp experience for your child and the center as a whole.
- We are aware of the challenges and difficulties it is to secure and ensure a safe space for your child during the summer. But it is important that you do not mislead the camp directors and coordinators.
- We will do our best to accommodate and assist if we feel we're able to ensure a "SafeFun" experience for all involved.
- We receive a limited grant of 5000\$ (not guaranteed for this summer yet) by a city/government organization. This pays for 2 "shadows" whose primary role is the integration of children into the group and daily activities.
- We have hired this summer (through fundraising) a Special Needs Coordinator who will assess the camper, help the animators with tips and suggestions and have an open and honest communication with parents. Remember, we are on your side.
- It is not a "one on one" service. We cannot provide that unfortunately. So certain levels of autism and other conditions may not be able to be safely secured in an outdoor camp program. The "shadows" are also not GIVEN OR FIXED to one camper during the summer. They go where the need is.
- If you have a specialized/experienced special needs animator that can work with your child at camp, we will certainly consider it. However, they must be paid by you or

- through your school, city, CLSC, government agency, personal or another type of grant.
- If this is the situation, we kindly ask you to look at other camp organizations that may be better suited to provide a good experience for your child. One resource is montrealfamilies.com or Autism Montreal.

Question 13: Do we get an official camp receipt?

- You will receive a Releve-24 if your invoice has been paid that you've provided your Social Insurance Number at the time of registration.
- In January of the following camp year we will send out a reminder to make sure that your information is up-to-date at which point we will issue your RL-24's through Amilia, our registration platform. If you do not provide your information or you have not paid your camp fees then we will not be able to issue your RL-24.

Question 14: What is SAFEFUN and who are the animators?

- This is the philosophy of our camp. Our objective is to make sure that the safety of our campers will never be compromised for the sake of fun.
- All our animators go through a 2-month city certified training, participate, and agree to our "Safe
 Environment" protocols. All are first aid certified and the majority are known to us through our
 programming and go through a police check (18 years and over).
- We are also accredited from the Quebec Camp Association.
- We have been organizing's camps since 1984.
- Theo Vecera has been leading the camp structure and overall programming since 1997. We welcome over 550+ campers every summer and hire most of our staff from RDP (Fun Fact: Many were once campers and participants at the YLC!).

As a university student, she was a YLC coordinator of the Girls Club and Musicpalooza programs and sang at some of our youth Festival's!


Amy has a bachelor's degree in Human Relations and a graduate diploma in Journalism. She is also a mom of two young children. Setting a positive example for them is her top priority.


